1. Project partners' and advisors' at TRUST Launch meeting, Paris, October 2015



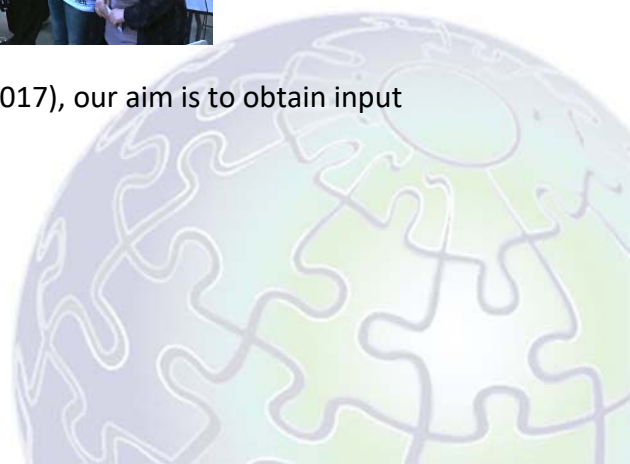
2. Vulnerable populations (sex workers, indigenous peoples) and ethics committee chairs, Nairobi, May 2016
